

NOTICE OF MAKING
THE SOUTHEND BOROUGH COUNCIL (WAITING, LOADING AND STOPPING AND PARKING PLACES) (MAP BASED) (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2021
THE SOUTHEND-ON-SEA CITY COUNCIL (WAITING, LOADING, STOPPING AND PARKING PLACES) (MAP BASED) (LEIGH WARD JUNCTION PROTECTION) AMENDMENT NO.31 ORDER 2023

Notice of hereby given that Southend-on-Sea City Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4 and 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 , and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act has made the following:

- **To install** junction protection; no waiting at any time (double yellow lines) **AND** no loading or unloading at any time (double yellow kerb blip markings) at approximately 10 metres at each of the junction locations below:
 - (a) Ashleigh Drive with Queens Road
 - (b) Dawlish Drive with Queens Avenue
 - (c) Queens Avenue with Elm Road
 - (d) Queens Avenue with Leigh Hall Road
 - (e) Redcliff Drive with Queens Road
 - (f) Torquay Drive with Elm Road
- Map-based Schedules to replace plans in the appropriate schedule of ‘The 2021 Order’ (as amended)

These changes will amend the following Order;

- a) The Southend Borough Council (Waiting, Loading and Stopping and Parking Places) (Map Based) (Consolidation) Order 2021 (as amended) (to be known as ‘The 2021 Order’). The remainder of The 2021 Order will remain in full force and effect.

The amendments shall come into operation on 28th July 2023 and may be cited as The Southend-on-Sea City Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map Based) (Leigh Ward Junction Protection) Amendment No.31 Order 2023.

Copies of the Order, which will come into operation on 14th September 2023, the statement of reasons for making the Order and plans showing the affected streets can be inspected during normal office hours, inclusive for a period of six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made at the Civic Centre, Victoria Avenue, Southend-on-Sea, SS2 6ER and at <https://www.southend.gov.uk/tro>.

Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.
