Notice is hereby given that Southend-on-Sea City Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4, and 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act has made the following Orders:

- The Southend-on-Sea City Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map-Based) (St Laurence Junction Protection Phase 1) Amendment No.5 Order 2024
- The Southend-on-Sea City Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map-Based) (Rectory Grove Disabled Bays) Amendment No.6 Order 2024

PTO1097 – St Laurence Junction Protection Phase 1

To introduce junction protection restrictions - No Waiting at Any Time (double yellow lines) and No Loading or Unloading at Any Time (double yellow kerb blip markings) for 10 metres at each of the junctions (both sides of every road) listed below:

- 1. Aldrin Way with Neil Armstrong Way
- 2. Avro Road with Eastwoodbury Lane
- 3. Bristol Road with Eastwoodbury Lane
- 4. Derek Gardens with Alton Gardens (north)
- 5. Derek Gardens with Alton Gardens (south)
- 6. Fulford Drive with Whitehouse Road

- 7. Fulford Drive with Meakins Close
- 8. Meakins Close with Blatches Chase
- 9. Oakengrange Drive with Alton Gardens
- 10. Oakengrange Drive with Hampton Gardens
- 11. Vickers Road with Eastwoodbury Lane
- 12. Whitehouse Meadows with Whitehouse Road

On the junction of Comet Way with Comet Way; to revoke 10 metres of the current No Waiting, Mon-Fri, 6am-6pm restrictions and introduce junction protection restrictions - No Waiting at Any Time (double yellow lines) and No Loading or Unloading at Any Time (double yellow kerb blip markings).

PTO1092 – Rectory Grove Disabled Bays

To revoke disabled parking bays from outside No.28 and to replace them outside No.30. To revoke the Limited Waiting bays Mon-Sat, 2hrs no return within 4hrs, from outside No.30 and to replace them outside No.28.

These changes will amend the following Order: The Southend Borough Council (Waiting, Loading and Stopping and Parking Places) (Map Based) (Consolidation) Order 2021 (as amended) (to be known as 'The 2021 Order'). The remainder of 'The 2021 Order' will remain in full force and effect. Map-based Schedules to replace plans in the appropriate schedule of 'The 2021 Order' (as amended).

The amendments shall come into operation on 17th October 2024 and may be cited as:

- The Southend-on-Sea City Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map-Based) (St Laurence Junction Protection Phase 1) Amendment No.5 Order 2024
- The Southend-on-Sea City Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map-Based) (Rectory Grove Disabled Bays) Amendment No.6 Order 2024

Copies of the Order, which will come into operation on 17th October 2024, the statement of reasons for making the Order and plans showing the affected streets can be inspected during normal office hours, inclusive for a period of six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made at the Civic Centre, Victoria Avenue, Southend-on-Sea, SS2 6ER and at <u>https://www.southend.gov.uk/tro</u>.

Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.
